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Regulations Relating to PG Course of Study (Four Semesters, following CBCS) in Sanskrit, Philosophy, Pali, Linguistics, Ancient Indian and World History, English, Bengali and other subjects under Humanities attached to the Post Graduate Faculty of Arts, PG Faculty of Traditional Oriental Learning, The Sanskrit College and University

- ✓ These Regulations may be called The Sanskrit College and University Regulations relating to PG Course (Four Semesters).
- ✓ It shall apply to every candidate persecuting the above courses in this University.
- ✓ These Regulations shall come into effect from the academic session 2017-18.

Regulations

1. General

1.1. The course of study leading to the Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree in different subjects will generally be conducted by the respective Department of The Sanskrit College and University.

1.2. The University shall lay down from time to time such subsidiary rules of admission, courses of study and methods of examination as may be deemed necessary for the maintenance of standards of University education, in conformity with State policies and directives.

2. Duration of the Course

2.1. The duration of the Post Graduate course will be of two full academic sessions including project work, field trip /study tour / internship, divided into four semesters.

2.2. It is stipulated that a candidate will have to qualify Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree course within a maximum of four (04) years from his/her date of Admission.

2.3. The classes may be held both in the Department or allied Departments/ Institutions subject to the availability of the resources and approval of the Departmental Committee.

3. Eligibility Criteria:

3.1. Students of The Sanskrit College and University who have successfully qualified Honours courses will be selected on the basis of merit in terms of marks secured at the Honours level. Such students will fill up Sixty percent (60%) of the total number of seats.

3.2. The remaining Forty percent (40%) of the total number of seats will be filled up through a written Admission Test conducted by the respective departments. Students from Universities other than The Sanskrit College and University who have successfully qualified Honours courses with minimum of Sixty percent (60%) of the total marks will be eligible to apply for appearing at the Admission Test. Such students of The Sanskrit College and University who have successfully qualified Honours courses but have not been able to take admission on the basis of merit, may also apply for appearing at the Admission Test.

3.2.1. For the first three years (or till the time The Sanskrit College and University begins to send out successful Under Graduate candidates) the admission to Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree courses will take place through a written examination for all candidates, irrespective of their University affiliation at the Under Graduate level, with special preference (the modalities of which will be decided by the Honourable Vice-

Chancellor) given to students qualifying their Under Graduate level examinations from the erstwhile Sanskrit College.

3.3. Reservations for SC/ ST/ OBC/ PC candidates shall be applicable as per Government rules, directives and constitutional provisions. For candidates belonging to the SC and ST categories there will be, as mandated by the Government, a relaxation of the minimum eligibility criteria (cut-off percentage) by 10%.

3.4. All applications will be received online through the University website. The detailed admission schedule and procedure will be intimated at appropriate time during the admission process.

3.5. After selection for admission, the candidate shall, within the date fixed by the University, deposit the necessary fees prescribed for the purpose. If the candidate fails to deposit the fees within the stipulated time, his/ her selection shall be liable for cancellation. Such a candidate shall not be admitted to the course unless specific order for admission is made or an extension of the date of payment is granted by the appropriate authority.

4. Course of Study

4.1. A candidate admitted to Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree course shall register himself/ herself as a full-time student of The Sanskrit College and University.

4.2. All Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree courses will follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS).

4.3. A student registered for Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree course in a particular subject shall not be permitted to seek admission and pursue concurrently to any other equivalent or higher degree course in this university or elsewhere.

4.4. A student shall be deemed to have pursued a regular course of study in a subject provided he/ she has an attendance of at least **75 per cent**. Taking part in field trips/ educational tours, undertaking projects, presenting seminars, writing dissertations, appearing for VIVA etc. will be treated mandatory in calculation of the said percentage. A student will only be allowed to write the end-semester examination if his/her total attendance percentage for that semester is 75% and above.

4.5. The attendance of a candidate shall be counted from the date on which the respective classes begin (to be notified by the respective departments), or from the date on which he/ she is admitted, whichever is later.

4.6. A candidate with attendance between 65% to 74% will be declared Non-collegiate. Such a candidate may be permitted to write his/her end semester examination after being allowed by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the Head of the Department in writing and after having paid the appropriate Non-collegiate fees.

4.7. The University shall have the power to condone a deficiency in attendance, as per the instructions given by the competent authorities.

4.8. A student debarred from writing the end-semester examination due to insufficient attendance may be allowed to take re-admission for the same semester only in the next year.

4.9. The syllabus as presented along with the Regulation shall be changed, if so required by the University from time to time.

5. Examinations

5.1. End semester examinations shall be held every six months. The schedule of the examinations shall be duly notified.

5.2. Semester I, II, III and IV examinations will be sequentially held at the interval of every six months.

5.3. The full marks for each paper in all subjects of the Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree course will be 50, out of which the end-semester examination will carry 40 marks and Internal Assessment will carry 10 marks. The cumulative full marks of all the papers for all semesters combined will be **1000**.

5.4. The time allotted for each paper of 40 marks at the end-semester examination will be 02 hours.

5.5. At the beginning of each semester, the respective departments will notify the details of the modalities of the Internal Assessment that will carry 10 marks for each paper for that semester.

5.6. The qualifying marks for **each** paper under the categories Core Course (CC), Major Elective (ME), Project-Viva-Seminar (CC) will be **20** marks out of the full marks of 50, while for Open Elective (OE) it will be **20** marks out of the full marks of 50.

5.7. A student who fails to secure the qualifying marks in any paper will be allowed to appear in that paper when the corresponding semester examination is held next. He/ she will be allowed two such consecutive chances for qualifying each paper.

5.8. A student, if he/ she so desires, may apply in prescribed format (and after paying the requisite fees) for the cancellation of any paper or papers (maximum two) in any semester examination within 10 working days from the date of issue the Mark Sheet and may re-appear in those papers in the next available examination. The marks obtained in that examination will be treated as his/ her final marks. This facility shall however be offered only once per semester. It is stipulated that a candidate opting for cancellation of any paper or papers will have to qualify in those papers within four (04) years from his/her date of registration.

5.9. A student may apply in prescribed format (after paying the requisite fees) and within time stipulated by the authorities for review of marks obtained in any paper or papers in any semester. The marks obtained upon review assessment will be deemed final.

5.10. A student will be declared to have passed the Post Graduate (Master in Arts) Degree examination on the basis of the results in semesters I, II, III and IV examinations and will be eligible to receive appropriate degree issued by The Sanskrit College and University.

5.11. The duly constituted Board of Examiners, shall meet after each semester-end examination to consider and recommend the results to the Vice-Chancellor for approval.

5.12. After the Honourable Vice-Chancellor's approval, The Controller of Examinations shall arrange to tabulate and incorporate the marks awarded, both assessed internally and in the semester-end examinations, to prepare the results and issue Mark Sheets.

5.13. The final mark-sheet shall categorically indicate the paper code, paper title and paper credit, full marks, marks obtained by the candidate in each paper along with the total marks, separately showing marks for internal assessment and semester-end examinations, in numerical and in CGPS.

5.14. Each successful candidate shall receive his/ her degree in the form of a certificate stating the year of passing and the grade in which he/ she was placed.

5.15. In case any issue emerges/ difficulties arise in pursuance of these Regulations the matter will be discussed by the Departmental Committee/ Board of Studies and the recommendation/s shall be forwarded to the Honourable Vice-Chancellor for approval.

5.16. These Regulations will remain in force till alterations are made by the competent authorities of the University.
